



## General Meeting Minutes

November 12, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. with Sondra Bradshaw presiding. This month the topic was about the new MacBook Pro that Apple introduced on October 27. Art Gorski was the presenter. Here are some bullet points of his talk on the new MacBook Pro.

- The new MacBook Pro comes in a 13 inch display and a more powerful 15 inch display. The MacBook Air 11 inch has been discontinued. We have the MacBook Air 13 inch and the MacBook with the 12" display.
- The new MacBook Pro straddles the line between the MacBook Air and the old MacBook Pro.
- It is smaller and lighter and more expensive. It has four thunderbolt ports which use a series of dongles that are new now, but will become an industry standard in the next two years.
- The higher end model has a Touch Bar above the keyboard. Both models have an improved version of the MacBook keyboard, which might be a downside to some users compared to the old MacBook Pro keyboard.
- Art demonstrated how the Touch Bar functions with different apps. The Touch Bar has predictive text as in the iPhone and iPad.
- Better light display. More powerful speakers. Big Track Pad. It has USB-C ports, which can be used for a number of protocols like Thunderbolt, USB, and video.
- The Power Connector is no longer MagSafe, any of the USB-C ports can be used for power.
- No start-up chime. You start up the computer by opening the lid. The high end models have better graphics, better processors.

- Art showed us a website he created several years ago from **Weebly**. The purpose of this website is to make available applications he has created for the Mac and iOS devices. This is a hobby of his. He gives these apps away for free.
- Art demonstrated the process of setting up a website by using Weebly.

Safari's password saving feature is very convenient, but risky. If someone wants to get your passwords, they can just go into your preferences and find them. That is why Art has that feature turned off. He uses 1Password, a password manager software.

Art was asked to explain the advantages of using a Mail program instead of using a web based mail program. If one accesses their mail through a web browser, then there is no mail stored on the computer. By using a mail program such as Apple Mail, the mail is downloaded and stored on the computer.
